- ❖ The minutes of the May meeting were accepted as presented.
- ❖ Don Brinks presented the Business Manager's Report.
 - Income and expenses for January through April 2005 were:
 - Total Revenue of \$443,956
 - Total Disbursements of \$382,321
 - Excess Revenue (+/-) of +\$31,217
 - Cash Balance as of April 30, 2005 of \$208,152
 - The KMGA Profit and Loss by Class Statement was distributed
 - The report was accepted
- ❖ Dave Ballingall presented the Greens Committee Report. His report included pictures of the new way to leave rakes in traps and the new and old irrigation control boxes.
 - Milham Park
 - The greens have rebounded from the stress of lack of irrigation in Aprils
 - The back tee on number 4 continues to improve and grow.
 - The ash tree that protects number 9 green will be attended to after being hit by lightning.
 - Consumers Energy is "updating" the electrical service to the pump house and the cart barn.
 - The 150 yard markers have been "down sized".
 - Red Arrow
 - The course conditions continue to improve due to the installation of 30 new sprinkler heads.
 - Eastern Hills
 - Tree work will begin.
 - The bunker behind number 7 on the West course is being refurbished.
 - Numerous Bluebird boxes show signs of nesting and fledglings.
- ❖ Jim Roschek presented the Director of Golf Report.
 - The news letter will contain more personal articles, good rounds, holes in one, etc....
 - Emails came in with respect to the following topics.
 - The course is in excellent condition
 - Players appreciate the conditions of the course and the good service
 - Trash baskets should be nearer the tee markers.
 - The "pipes" in the center of the fairway at 150 yards are too large a diameter!
 - Jim the starter at Milham Park is greatly appreciated, even though most of his day is spent in the air conditioned gazebo!

- At the present time not many “promotions” are in place.
 - Business is good, the courses are very busy.
 - Range business is up.
 - Promotions include:
 - Two for one greens fees at Red Arrow
 - Warm up range ball at 25 ball increments
