1. MLK Commission Agenda Item / Fall Planting Event – Pamela Roland informed the board that construction will start in late July or early August. On the second Saturday of July, they will have their flowerbed partners come with shovels. She has six flower beds and doesn't want to invest in plants if they will be ripped up. They could smother the grass, have it mowed as low as possible and have mulch put on top of it. Pamela also wants to put five planters down on Harkins Court and install a chess/checkers activity table. Sean Fletcher said the concrete sidewalks, monument marker and arches will be repaired. The bricks will be repurposed to create an edge for the flowerbeds. Hawthorne trees will be planted in the fall to provide a buffer between the park and train tracks. Plaques will be placed on the trees. All the trees in the center circle of the park will be removed. The water fountain will be replaced with a bottle filler. There will be all new irrigation, a new park rules sign, and enclosed electrical outlets. If there is any extra money in the budget after the electrical enclosure, it will be used for the park benches and activity tables. Pamela plans to create a litter

slogan and will get t-shirts for people that are part of the litter control committee. She will also be holding a fundraiser to help raise money for these improvements.
